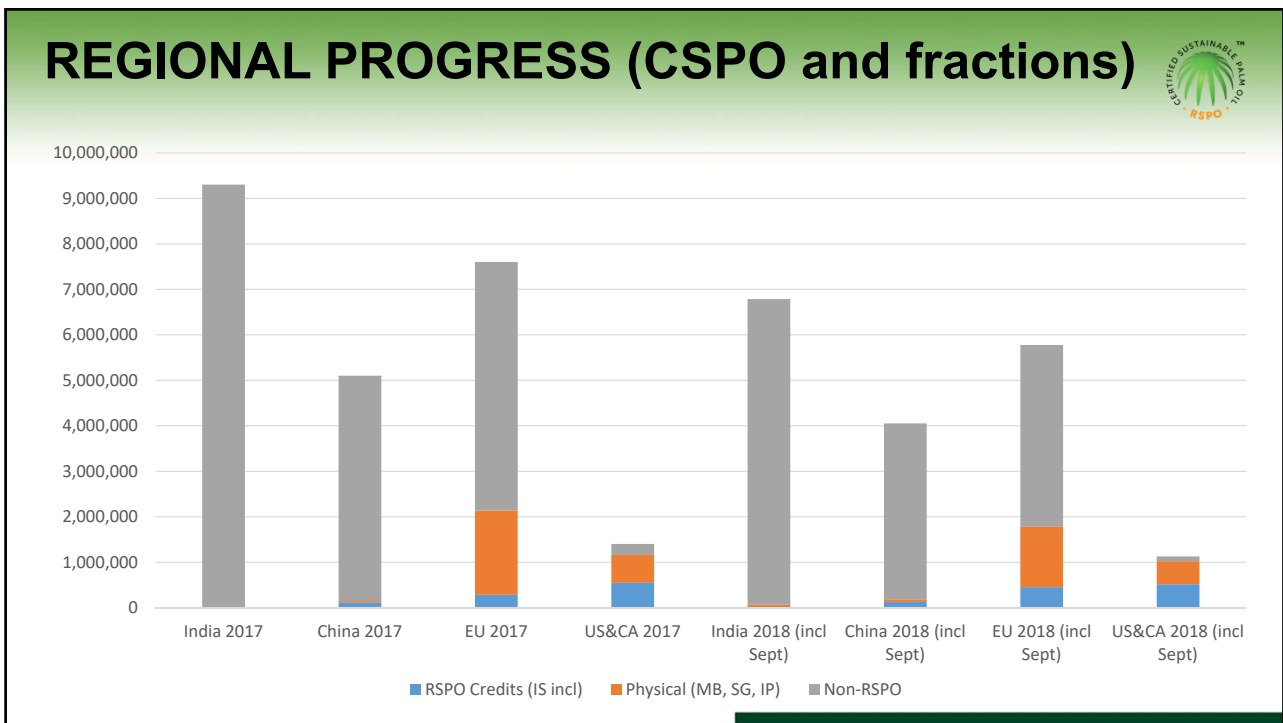
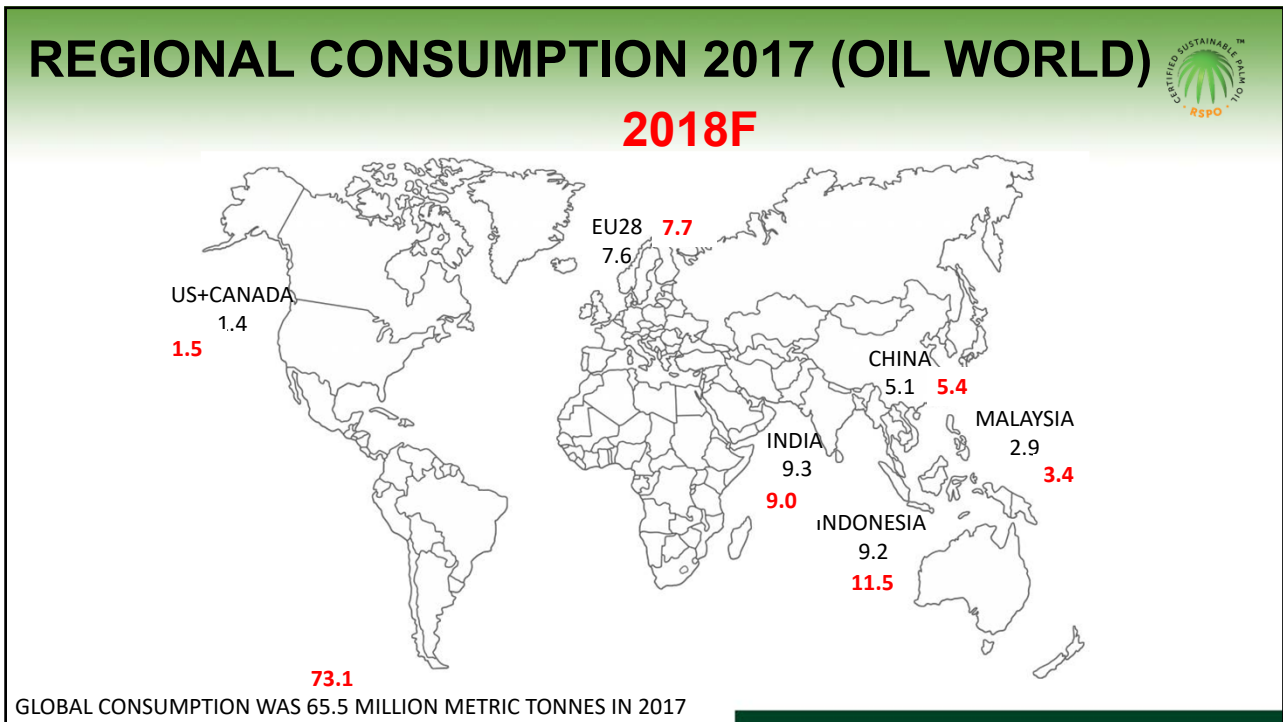


### E=MC<sub>2</sub>

- E = EU & US 100% CSPO by 2020
- M = Malaysia & Indonesia 50% CSPO by 2020
- C = China (10%) & India (30%) CSPO by 2020
- C = Composition of 30% of smallholder volume, 1.2 million families or 2.4 million ha by 2018.
